PROCEEDINGS

This report provides a summary account of the second Public Information Centre (PIC) held for the St. Marys Future Solid Waste Disposal Needs Environmental Assessment (EA) Study. A copy of this report will be included in the final Environmental Assessment (EA).

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1.0 Introduction

The Town of St. Marys has retained R.J. Burnside & Associates Limited (Burnside) to undertake an Individual Environmental Assessment (EA) study to identify a solution that addresses the Town's post-diversion municipal solid waste disposal needs. This study is being carried out in accordance with the Environmental Assessment Act and the approved Terms of Reference for the study.

A Public Information Centre (PIC) was arranged by the Project Team. The PIC was intended to gather and respond to public comments on the process. It focussed on:

- Describing the proposed study and purpose.
- Presenting the preliminary assessment of Alternative Expansion Methods.
- Identifying the next steps in the EA process (i.e., completion and issuance of draft document).

This report discusses comments provided during the PIC and related to the draft work plans.

2.0 Method of Notification

Details of the date, time, location and purpose of the PIC's were published in the following newspapers:

- The St. Marys Independent Friday, June 10 & June 17, 2016
- The St. Marys Journal Argus Wednesday, June 8 & Jun 15, 2016

Notification of the PIC's was also sent to review agencies, potentially affected First Nation communities, land owners within 1000 m of the landfill site and any other stakeholders who expressed an interest in being contacted during the Terms of Reference stage. A copy of the Notice of PIC #2 was also posted on the Town of St. Marys website.

Review agencies and Indigenous communities were also provided with digital copies of the draft environmental studies on a CD-R. All of the draft work plans and additional background documentation, including the PIC display boards were also made available on the Town's website. All review agencies and Indigenous communities were asked to provide their comments by July 15, 2016 to allow incorporation into the draft EA Report.

A copy of the advertisements, letters and email notices is provided in Appendix A. The information provided in Appendix A also indicates what, if any, draft studies were included with the notice.

3.0 Public Meeting Format

Attendees were greeted, asked to sign the registration sheet, and provided with a comment form. The PIC was an 'open-house' format whereby attendees were able to view project information displayed and to ask questions of Town of St. Marys and Burnside staff who were in attendance. No formal presentation was made.

A copy of the display boards is provided in Appendix B and the attendance sheet can be found in Appendix C.

Participants were also asked to provide input to the process by completing the available comment forms. If individuals wished to take comment forms home to fill out later, they were asked to return their comments, at the address, email or fax number provided on the comment sheet, before July 15, 2016.

4.0 Participation Levels and Summary of Comments Received

A total of seven people attended the PIC. Submitted comment forms to the study team during the PIC are summarized on Table 1 and included in Appendix D. Additionally, verbal comments were noted as summarized in Table 2.

	Any chance in entrance location will require sightline analysis, and updates to traffic impact study. Resident plans to contact County to review posted speed limit along section of Road 123.
Concerned with visibility (2 people)	A gap in the perimeter berm was identified allowing a sightline from an upper story window into the site.
	Discussion with the landowner included the possibility of assessing and improving the berm, or the planting of more mature trees along the site line to mitigate the visual impacts. Such assessment and construction/planting is ongoing for the Town during current operations and is expected to continue following approval of the EA.

A draft EA Report is proposed for stakeholder review during Q3-2016. The EA Report will then be finalized during Q4-2016, considering all comments received on the draft, and submitted for Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change for approval.










Notice of Public Information Centre Future Solid Waste Disposal Needs Environmental Assessment Town of St. Marys

The Study

The Town of St. Marys (Town) has initiated an Individual Environmental Assessment (EA) under the **Environmental Assessment** Act for the identification and selection of a preferred solid waste disposal option. The St. Marys landfill site, located at 1221 Water Street South, is nearing its current approved capacity. The Town has reviewed options to manage solid waste over the next 40 years. The preferred alternative is to expand the existing landfill. A number of methods of expansion are possible at the site. Work plans were undertaken to evaluate the landfill expansion options



available. While our preliminary analysis suggests that a combined vertical and horizontal expansion of the St. Marys landfill is preferred, public input is requested before submission of the EA to the Ministry.

Consultation

Members of the public, agencies and other interested persons are encouraged to participate in the study by attending consultation opportunities or contacting the Project Team directly. Project notices are being advertised on the Town's website, in the local newspaper, as well as through direct communications with local landowners, Aboriginal communities, review agencies and utilities.

A Public Information Centre (PIC) has been arranged to present the results of the EA studies that were undertaken, and describe the initial evaluation of the alternative expansion methods. The PIC will gather and respond to public comments on the process. Presentation materials pertaining to the studies and the alternative methods being considered will be available for public review on the Town's website: http://www.townofstmarys.com/en/living-here/Landfill-Environmental-Assessment.aspx. The next phase of the EA will consider comments received during the PIC.

In the third incidence of a collision involving a school bus in the past two weeks in the sens Stratford vicinity, two people were transport- driv ed to hospital with what were described by to a the Oxford County detachment of the Ontario adul Provincial Police (OPP) as "non-life threaten- tran ing injuries" after a bus left the roadway near wen Maplewood and struck a utility pole on the morning of Monday, June 13.

OPP say officers were summoned just after vest 8:30 a.m. to investigate on the 43rd Line of from Zorra Township between the Perth/Oxford and Road and Road 96. According to a news re- Cou lease from police, an Elgie Bus Lines vehicle was southbound on the 43rd Line when it left the roadway, entered the ditch, struck a hydro ken pole and came to a stop off the roadway.

"The impact resulted in the male driver and one 13 year-old female student being transported to a local hospital," the news release Pert explained. "In total, 17 students were on the on I bus at the time of the collision. Three other cers students were treated at the scene and released the with minor injuries by Perth County paramedics.'

Also responding and assisting at the scene were firefighters with the Uniondale station of Zorra Fire Services.

"Police would like to thank the witnesses sign who stopped and helped out at the scene," the rele-OPP news release added.

On June 1, a school bus driver was charged with failure to yield after pulling out into the path of an oncoming vehicle after stopping at the intersection of the Embro Road and the ing Tavistock Road. Ten students were on the bus bloo at the time, but only the driver required treatment in hospital for minor injuries.

Then in spectacular fashion on June 6, a bus left the roadway near Amulree and struck two trees. Shortly after the last of six students plus the driver had evacuated the vehicle, it Pert became engulfed in flames. The St. Marys landfill site, located at 1221 Water Street South, is nearing its current approved capacity. The Town has reviewed options to manage solid waste over the next 40 years. The preferred alternative is to expand the existing landfill. A number of methods of expansion are possible at the site. Work plans were undertaken to evaluate the landfill expansion options available. While our preliminary analysis suggests that a combined vertical and horizontal expansion of the St. Marys landfill is preferred, public input is requested before submission of the EA to the Ministry.

Consultation

Members of the public, agencies and other interested persons are encouraged to participate

in the study by attending consultation opportunities or contacting the Project Team directly. Project notices are being advertised on the Town's website, in the local newspaper, as well as through direct communications with local landowners, Aboriginal communities, review agencies and utilities.

A Public Information Centre (PIC) has been arranged to present the results of the EA studies that were undertaken, and describe the initial evaluation of the alternative expansion methods. The PIC will gather and respond to public comments on the process. Presentation materials pertaining to the studies and the alternative methods being considered will be available for public review on the Town's website: http://www.townofstmarys.com/en/living-here/Landfill-Environmental-Assessment.aspx. The next phase of the EA will consider comments received during the PIC.







In addition to the discussions which occurred during the PIC the Town wishes to reiterate our recognition of your concerns related to site odour, water quality, traffic and visual impacts.

In relation to odour as discussed the Town is in the process of working towards replacing existing equipment at the site in order to address operational challenges experienced this past spring. During the development and selection of the preferred alternative method, and determining the cell staging during the site life the Town and its Project Team will be considering the potential for odour generation as a negative impact. Ultimately the site will meet all Provincial requirements and obtain necessary approvals prior to commencing operations.

Water quality continues to be monitored at the site. To date no offsite impacts have been detected in ground or surface water quality. The Project Team will design the site in a manner that limits potential for impacts, and will continue monitoring to confirm water quality.

During the discussions related to traffic you indicated concerns with traffic speeds, and potential visibility concerns related to a potentially relocated site entrance. Although it is outside of the scope of this Environmental Assessment, any entrance relocation would be subject to an engineer's report on traffic, which would include an assessment of speeds and sightlines on the corner. We also note that responsibility and control of the higher speed sections of the road, Perth Road 123, reside with Perth County.

Lastly, the Town recognizes the potential for visual impacts as a result of berm and tree screen placement. Improvements to both of these screening features will be considered as part of the detailed design. In the interim the Town maintains a tree planting program at the landfill, which will hopefully mitigate any impacts.
