<b>Title:</b>	Allin-Stone Family Genealogy Fonds
<b>Creator(s):</b>	Greta Milne (19-- – 1991)

<b>Administrative History/ Biographical Sketch:</b>	<p>Greta (nee Allin Stone) Milne (19-- – 1991) was a family historian whose extensive research was greatly influenced by her husband's genealogical passion. Born in the St. Marys area, Mrs. Milne married J. Mervyn Milne of West Nissouri in July 1929 before they moved to Montreal where Mr. Milne was an engineer for Bell Canada and they raised their four children. The family frequently returned to the St. Marys area to visit family and friends before moving back to St. Marys when Mr. Milne retired from his position in Montreal.</p> <p>Influenced by her husband's passion for genealogical research, Mrs. Milne began researching her own family tree. Through correspondence with distant relatives, researchers, archives, libraries and occasionally travelling for research, Mrs. Milne was able to amass a great amount of information about local families and their relatives across North America, the Caribbean, and Europe.</p> <p>When her husband died in 1983, Mrs. Milne continued with some of his genealogical work alongside her own until her death on September 4, 1991.</p>
<b>Custodial History:</b>	<p>After Mrs. Milne's death in 1991, her research on the Allin, Stone and related families were transferred to the St. Marys Museum alongside much of her husband's research regarding local families.</p> <p>Research of Mr. and Mrs. Milne's that did not pertain specifically to the St. Marys area was donated to the Stratford-Perth Archives.</p>
<b>Scope and Content:</b>	<p>This fonds contains genealogical research pertaining to the Allin and Stone families of the St. Marys area and their relations. The research notes, photocopies, transcriptions and correspondence between researchers constitute an extensive record of marriages, births, deaths, property and immigration. Immediate sources of information were census records, newspaper notices and articles, church records, cemetery stones, government registers, wills, land transfers, historical correspondence and correspondence between researchers and distant family members.</p> <p>References to family relations include but are not limited to Stratford, Brampton, Goderich, Ben Miller, Bowmanville, Vancouver, Winnipeg, Montreal, New York State, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Kansas, Michigan, Utah, California, England, Scotland and Barbados.</p>

	<p>Other family names in the fonds include but are not limited to Senn, Oakam, Beavers/Beevers, Eacrett, Lee, Jackson, Huller, Fuller, Ford, Walter, Smail, Wakely, Brimacombe/Brimmacome, Bragg.</p> <p>This collection contains raw and processed data: research notes, correspondence, biographical sketches, family groups, family trees, photographs, one publication by Ruth Pearce on Allin and related families.</p> <p>The fonds was divided into the following series by Mrs. Milne and have been kept by the St. Marys Museum to maintain original order.</p> <p>Series 1: Beavers-Eacrett  Series 2: Beavers of USA  Series 3: Fuller-Ford  Series 4: Stones – Canada  Series 5: Wm.
