### Fonds/Collection Description

<b>Title:</b>	Dale Family Papers
<b>Creator(s):</b>	Frederika Frances Dale and Dale Family
<b>Dates of Materials:</b>	1890s – 1990s
<b>Physical Description:</b>	<p>This collection consists of photographs, pins, medals, newspaper clippings, and a large number of miscellaneous accessioned artifacts.</p> <p>137 photographs (b&amp;w) 68 cm textual records</p>
<b>Administrative History/ Biographical Sketch:</b>	<p>The material was accumulated during the 90 years that the Dale family lived at 89 Ontario Street South in St. Marys. Although portions of the material pre-date the Dales' arrival at this address and represent earlier family records, most of the collection was created in the Ontario Street home and certainly stored there.</p> <p>Members of this family were William Dale (1849-1921) and his wife, Frederika Ryckman (1876-1971.) They were married in 1901 and had four children: Margaret (1904-1971), Douglas (1906-1991), Frances (1908-2001) and Emmaline (1912-2000).</p> <p>The Dale family was significant not only in St. Marys history but beyond this immediate area, for instance in the history of University College, U of T and Central Collegiate in Stratford. Therefore, their biographical notes are long.</p> <p><b>William Dale</b> was born in Yorkshire, England on October 1, 1849, the son of William Dale and Frances Stevenson. Following the death of Frances and two of their six children, William Dale Senior immigrated to Canada with two sons and two daughters to a farm in Nissouri Township. By the time of the 1897 Belden Atlas, the Dales are living on a farm on the East Mitchell Road Concession in Blanshard Township, southwest of St. Marys.</p> <p>William Dale Junior was an exceptional student. He attended the St. Marys Grammar School but it only provided the first three years of university preparation. For his final secondary education he attended Upper Canada College where he was head boy. Moving on to University College in Toronto, he earned his BA in 1871, receiving scholarships in both mathematics and the Classics, and a gold medal in the Classics. He also won an award for general proficiency. He received his MA in 1873.</p> <p>He taught school during the time he was doing his post graduate work to earn his fees and was headmaster at Uxbridge High School from 1871 until 1874 although he was only 22 when he began this engagement. He became principal at the St. Marys Collegiate Institute from January to December in 1875, replacing William Tytler who had a new appointment in Guelph. Dale also taught classics and was long remembered as an inspiring teacher. One of his former students at the St. Marys Collegiate was Presbyterian minister and writer Charles Gordon (whose famous pen name was Ralph Connor). Gordon remembers Dale with affection in his autobiography <i>Postscript to Adventure</i>.</p> <p>Dale filled a vacancy at Upper Canada College from January to June in 1876 and then moved</p>

to Quebec City where he was Rector of the English High School until 1879. He was next appointed to the position he seemed to have been working towards from the beginning – in the Classics Department of University College, U of T. Dale became Associate Professor of Latin, lecturing on Roman history and stayed at University College until 1895. He was a valued and respected faculty member with unusual ability to inspire his students.

Serious problems arose that led to the end of this part of William Dale's career. The Ontario Government at that time was technically responsible for university appointments and these seemed to be subject to political pressure. Dale, among others, became very concerned about inferior hiring practices, nepotism, suppression of free speech, and unfair allocation of funds within the faculties. Deciding to take a stand, Dale pointed out these inadequacies in the Toronto Globe. Students, led by William Lyon McKenzie King, rallied in support and boycotted classes. Dale was asked to resign, but refused. He was dismissed in 1895. (Canadian poet and dramatist James Reaney wrote a play about this incident, The Dismissal. It was produced at Hart House in 1977 and published in 1978.)

For Dale, his farm home in St. Marys was always a place of retreat. But he did not leave academic life behind and his reputation as a man of principle remained. He was elected by the alumni to the Senate of the University of Toronto, a position he held until his death in 1921. He lectured at Queen's College, Kingston, 1895-1896, and was a special lecturer at McMaster University from 1896 to 1906. Even when he retired to his St. Marys home permanently, he did some teaching at the Collegiate, helping out during the years of World War I when it was difficult to get qualified staff. He was acting principal there in 1914.

In his retirement years, Dale served on St. Marys Town Council and was mayor in 1917-1918. He was on the Public Library Board and active in the Methodist Church, teaching a young men's class. He remained a scholar and an educator and was long remembered for his lectures and discussion groups on conditions in Europe both before and after the war. He died at home on February 16, 1921.

William Dale married Florence Frederika Ryckman, daughter of the Reverend Dr. Ryckman of Brockville on April 10, 1901. They had four children: Margaret Ryckman, William Douglas, Frederika Frances and Agnes Emmaline.

**Note:** The permanent principal of St. Marys Collegiate Institute in 1914 was William Wright, a former student of Dale's, who left to take up a commission in the Canadian Expeditionary Force. Dale kept in close touch with him by letters. A number of Wright's letters to Dale with first-hand accounts of the campaign in France survive and are in the St. Marys Museum's archives. (They were found by Mervyn Milne and transferred to the Museum after Mr. Milne's death.) Lieutenant Wright was killed in France, a few weeks after the Battle of Vimy Ridge.

### **Florence Frederika Dale:**

Frederika (Ryckman) Dale was born in Dundas, Ontario, in 1876 to Edward B. Ryckman and Emmaline Edmond Baird. E. B. Ryckman was a well-known Methodist minister, an administrator and an educator. He was granted a doctor of divinity degree from Victoria College. Like other Methodist ministers of the day, he moved regularly from church to church both in Quebec and in Ontario and so Frederika grew up in a number of different locations.

Her family supported the higher education of women and she attended Queen's University. In 1898, she was one of the first women to earn a BA from this institution. William Dale, 27 years her senior, was her classics professor at Queen's. They were married in 1901 in

Brockville where her family was living at the time and moved to the Dale farm property southwest of St. Marys in Blanshard Township. By 1910, they had moved to 89 Ontario Street South in St. Marys where their four children grew up.

Frederika Dale ran her family's life so that her husband's scholarly work was as little disturbed as possible. She taught her children from an early age to help with the maintenance of the four-acre town property and with household chores, to run errands downtown and to work in the large vegetable garden.

Her husband died in 1921 in the midst of the post-war depression, intestate and with mortgages on some of his 900 acres. Frederika had not been involved in the financial management of this property and had to learn quickly. Fortunately her brother Edmond stepped in and helped get her affairs and her house in order. He was the oldest in the Ryckman family and she was the youngest and they were quite close.

Mrs. Dale was a pillar of the Methodist Church, the Women's Institute, the Women's Christian Temperance Union, the St. Marys Memorial Hospital Auxiliary and, during both World Wars, the Women's Patriotic League. She was a keen reader and became the first woman to serve on the St. Marys Public Library Board where her energy and organizational abilities led to a number of improvements, particularly in the delivery of library services to patrons. She was also an early advocate of services for mentally challenged members of the community.

She enjoyed travelling to visit relatives, especially her family in Toronto. As she became older, she grew to depend on her daughter Frances who made 89 Ontario Street her home while commuting to her teaching position in Stratford.

Frederika Dale died in St. Marys August 19, 1971, aged 95.

#### **Margaret Ryckman Dale:**

Margaret Dale, born in 1904, was the oldest of the Dale children. In the fonds are a number of letters from her to her mother who was away from St. Marys, possibly on family business. These letters indicate that even as a child of 12 or 13, Margaret was charged with considerable responsibility in the running of the home. She appears to have risen to this challenge very capably. A good student, she took extra lessons from her father in classics and, like her siblings, was expected to complete assignments in both Greek and Latin outside her regular school homework.

William Dale died when Margaret was 17 putting an end to these extra studies but she continued to do well at school and entered University College at U of T in the fall of 1923. She earned a degree in Honours Classics in 1927, attended Ontario College of Education and taught Classics at Kitchener Collegiate for at least two years. There she met her future husband Cyril R. Philp who later became principal of KCI and then Director of Education for the Kitchener-Waterloo area, and given an honorary doctorate for his work. They had two children: Margaret (married to Herb Chapman) and Richard.

The Philp family lived in Waterloo, kept in close touch with relatives in St. Marys and there were frequent visits back and forth. Margaret R. Dale Philp was killed in a car accident in 1972.

#### **William Douglas Dale:**

Douglas Dale, born in St. Marys in 1906, was the only son and second child of William and

Frederika Dale. He married Janet Marsden and farmed outside of Woodstock, New Brunswick where the Marsdens lived. Frederika and Frances took motor trips out to visit them and Douglas came home to St. Marys periodically.

In 1980 approximately, a widower with no children, he sold his farm and returned to St. Marys, staying at the Dale family home at 89 Ontario Street. He kept busy renewing old friendships and working on the property. His health failed in his final years and he died, in 1991, age 85, in a nursing home in Stratford.

### **Frederika Frances Dale**

Frances Dale, born September 6, 1908 in St. Marys, was the second daughter and third child of William and Frederika Dale. She attended elementary and secondary schools in St. Marys and at eight years of age began extra lessons in French, Latin, and algebra from her father. She also studied Greek for one year under his direction. These extra lessons stopped when William Dale died in 1921 when Frances was 12 years old.

She remained an excellent student and enjoyed her time at St. Marys Collegiate. She took part in many extracurricular activities and had a special interest in sports. She was an exceptional track and field athlete, winning every medal for five years. She also played tennis and softball and taught herself to swim – enjoying the fresh water of the quarries long before swimming was officially permitted there.

Frances Dale graduated from University College, Toronto in 1930 with degrees in the classics and honours physical education. She taught high school in Goderich from 1931-1934 and, from 1934 until 1971 taught physical education, English and Latin at Stratford Collegiate Institute and was also a guidance counsellor. She was remembered for her encouragement of girls' sports. During physical education classes, she didn't just tell her students what to do – she put on gym clothes and showed them! She initiated girls' volleyball at the WOSSA level and also developed tennis as a major school sport for both boys and girls. She retired in June 1971.

During her summer holidays, she enjoyed travelling, combining her trips with courses in gymnastics in England and Finland. She was a spectator at the 1936 Olympics in Berlin and brought home souvenirs of that controversial event. During her last trip to Europe in 1939 just before the outbreak of World War II, she was a participant in an international gymnastics festival, the Lyngiad, in Stockholm. Among the artifacts in the collection of the St. Marys Museum is a gas mask in its original box that she acquired in Liverpool that ominous summer – “just in case.”

Also among the Museum's artifact collection are various swimming awards including the Bronze Medallion, the Bronze Cross Award of Merit, and the Award of Distinction from the Royal Life Saving Society. She taught swimming at the YWCA in Stratford and even taught seniors' classes in St. Marys after her retirement using Bryant and Esther Rumble's covered pool in the east ward.

She had a long and satisfying retirement, spending a great deal of time sorting through her father's books and personal papers. She was involved in the UCW at the St. Marys United Church and was proud of her ability to maintain the four-acre property surrounding her home. She also enjoyed the Stratford Festival, letter-writing, reading and astronomy.

Frances Dale moved to Kingsway Residence a few years before she died on October 6, 2001.

	<p><b>Agnes <u>Emmaline</u> Dale:</b></p> <p>Emmaline Dale was born in 1912 in St. Marys, the youngest child of William Dale and Frederika Ryckman Dale. She grew up in St. Marys and a number of her letters to family members survive in the fonds.</p> <p>Emmaline Dale became a secretary and worked in Toronto, paying many visits to St. Marys. She enjoyed activities in Bloor Street United Church and sang in the church choir for more than 60 years. An accomplished musician, she often sang solos there.</p> <p>When her health grew uncertain, she moved to Kingsway Residence in St. Marys where she died, age 87, on March 20, 2001.</p>
<p><b>Custodial History:</b></p>	<p>The material was transferred to the archives of the St. Marys Museum over a period of years with some of the earliest items delivered by Frances Dale but the majority deposited in the archives by Larry Pfaff, long-time friend of the Dale family and of the St. Marys Museum. Larry assisted Frances as she made plans to move from the Ontario Street home to Kingsway Residence. He helped her sort the material in the house and to find proper repositories for some very significant items. When she sold 89 Ontario Street, he continued to work with her to sort boxes of papers and other items that she had removed from her home. Eventually, as executor of the estates of both Emmaline and Frances Dale, he continued to bring material to the Museum that had local and regional relevance. Therefore, most of the donated material arrived between 1996 and 2003.</p> <p>Because of the nature of the donation process – and also because it arrived at the Museum when the facility was experiencing its most severe overcrowding (that led to the construction of the archives addition) – it was hard to determine and retain original order. Museum staff did their best to keep it together as much as possible in boxes until time could be made to arrange and describe this important fonds.</p>
